Christopher dream was to go to China and he needed money in order to do this. The king and queen of Spain gave him the money he needed to buy ships. Columbus'

His famous adventures

He set sail from Europe on 3rd August, 1492, along with his sailors. They did not know where they would land.

The journey took them a really long time. He sailed to Cuba and discovered new lands. They called it 'The New World'. They arrived in America in 1492. Christopher Columbus did not discover America, as


Interesting facts!

the Vikings from Europe had already landed in America 500 years before, but he did not know this. He started regular contact between Europe and America though and introduced tomatoes and potatoes into Europe.
