Art & Design

This term our art unit is linked to our History topic *'What is better? Stone Age or Iron Age?'* We shall be looking closely at cave painting across Europe and recurring themes and then recreating our own cave art paintings.

P.E

Music

Maths

We start the term with Place Value, focusing on Hundred, Tens and Ones. We shall compare objects and compare and order numbers. The children will count in 50's and we will also begin our unit on addition and subtraction. The children will add and subtract 2 and 3 digit numbers.

Literacy

We shall be creating descriptive writing about the setting and characters.

Non Chronological Reports

We shall discover the language features of this type of writing before creating a report on Stone Age people.

History

For our history topic *'What is better? Stone Age or Iron Age?'* we shall be looking closely at the historical term *'Prehistory'* before learning about life during these periods of history.
