<u>National</u> <u>Curriculum</u> Objectives	Listen and show understanding of single words through physical response. Recognise a familiar question and respond with a simple rehearsed response. Read and show understanding of familiar single words Identify and use strategies for memorising new vocabulary Read carefully and show understanding of words, phrases and simple writing,.	Listen and identify rhyming words and particular sound in songs and rhymes. Join in with actions to accompany familiar songs, storie and rhymes and say some of the words. Using the knowledge of the sound of some letter strings, read aloud or say individual familiar words.
<u>Prior Learning –</u> <u>'Why here, why</u> <u>now?'</u>	Links in with the season of winter when people are more likely to have sore throat, earache etc.	Always a fascinating topic for children and in a season where there is new life it is a good time to start learnin words related to nature and animals.
Suggested Content	Introduction of key vocabulary via power point and flashcards Choral repetition of key words and joining in with a song. Matching the English with the Spanish word Miming something that hurts for a partner to guess. Introduction of some of the more well known wild animals through a simple story book Appreciating a video song about climate change and wildlife and how to do our bit Say what animals you like and dislike and which is your favourite. Ask others.
