<u>Christmas</u> Performances


Little did I know before starting as Head Teacher here at South Gosforth First School that the school was so full of such amazing performers!

'Talk For Writing'

In Spring term, we are going to be introducing a teaching approach called 'Talk for Writing' across school. This is a very structured and systematic method of teaching children to 'internalise' writing structures and then use these models to innovate and create their own pieces. We think that this approach will really help a lot of our children with their writing confidence and are looking forward to seeing the positive results that we hope this teaching method will bring!

Handwriting Focus

Alongside 'Talk for Writing' we are also going to be having a real focus on handwriting across school. Any extra support or practice that families could be doing at home with this alongside their children would be extremely helpful.

Changes to Reading Provision

Before we break up for the Christmas break, all children will be bringing a letter home linked to some changes that we are going to be making to the teaching of reading across school. This has largely come about because of new guidelines from Ofsted and we have worked very closely with Newcastle Head of School Effectiveness, alongside other consultants to ensure that our new provision is fit for purpose for our children. This new system for school and home reading will be in place after Christmas and it will look different to what is in place currently. Please rest assured that this has been very carefully thought about and planned by the staff and we believe that this new system will enable our pupils to make rapid progress in reading.
